Vera Crus, April 21.—Vera Crus tonight is in the hands of forces from the United States warships, but the occupation of the port was not accomplished without loss of American lives.

. Four Americans, bluefackets and marines, were killed by the fire of the Mexican oldiers, and twenty fell wounded. The Mexican loss is not known, but it is believed to have been heavy.

The water front, the customs house and all important piers, including those under the terminal work from which extend the railroads to the capital, have been occupied. All the territory around the American consulate is strongly patrolled, and detachments hold other sections of the city.

The Mexican commander, General Gus tavo Maas, offered a stubborn resistance to the American advance and for many hours there was fighting in the streets. Toward nightfall it was reported that the main body of the federal garrison was in retreat to the westward.






