With regard to the recent horrors in the mines of Colorado, Current Opinion says, "This, THE NEW YORK TIMES THINKS, is the lesson the coal operators in Colorado are learning. The employers, it says, are right in their stand for the 'open shop;' but in an important sense, they, too, as well as the unions, have stood for the 'closed shop;' closed against the unions. While they have employed union men, they have discouraged the unions and refused to hear the union's representatives.

"THE TIMES points to the plan under which 7,566 grievances have been settled in New York City in the garment industries since 'the Protocol of Peace' was signed in March, 1911, by which the union was recognized, but by which the right of men to contract individually as well as collectively was also recognized."

The report states that the minimum for such a family is \$408.26. Below this for such a family is actual suffering.


