

London, October 8.-While the immense armies of the belligerent powers of Europe are engaged in a death grapple along lines hundreds of miles in extent in battles which, for the numbers engaged, fierceness and stubbornness, have no precedent in history, the little army of Belgium is making a last stand behind the forts of Antwerp, one of the strongest fortified positions in the world.

For the moment, at least, the struggle around the chief port of Belgium attracts the most attention, for the result of the engagement there must have a considerable effect on the bigger battle between th Anglo-French and German forces, which extends from the Swiss frontier across France, almost to the North sea.




