Thousands at Ostend in Terror of German Raid

Charter for Railroad Line Paralleling State Road Will Not Be Asked Until After Legislature Meets

Promise to This Effect Is Made to Governor John M. Slaton by Attorneys Representing the North Georgia Mineral Railway.

LEGISLATURE OF STATE
WILL BE GIVEN CHANCE
TO PROTECT W. & A.

Action Was Taken After the Attorney General Had Concurred With Secretary of State That the Law Would Force Him to Grant Charter.

At the instance of Governor John M. Slaton, who has been working quietly to that end for several weeks, the attorneys for the North Georgia Mineral railway, which recently applied to Secretary of State Phil Cook for a charter to build a road paralleling the Western and Atlantic into Atlanta, have agreed not to demand the charter until the next regular session of the legislature convenes, in the summer of 1915, at which time it will have opportunity to take whatever steps it may deem proper for the protection of the state's railroad property. Meanwhile, the petition will be held under advisement by Secretary Cook.

The mineral railway, through its attorneys, King & Spaulding, of Atlanta, filed with the secretary of state its petition for a charter. Secretary Cook called upon Attorney General Orin for a ruling as to whether or not the granting of the charter, the execution of the rights of which, it is feared, may impair the value of the state road. Attorney General Orin concurred with Secretary Cook in his position that he had no other discretion than to grant the charter, inasmuch as the petition had met all the mandates of the law.

The secretary of state was then prevailed upon to do otherwise than grant the charter, as soon as he had completed his consideration of it. Pressure was brought to bear upon the governor to have him call a special session of the legislature, the only remaining medium through which the state could prevent the charter. Governor Slaton declined persistently to commit himself upon the matter, and he would make the question whether or not the governor would call the legislature a special session his own to settle with newspaper men at the capital, for, while everybody's guess is that the governor has something up his sleeve, no one could ascertain just what angle he was really working from.

Some sort of action was deemed imperative, but to call a special session of the legislature would entail an expense to the state of some \$75,000. Moreover, there is little time to spare during which the legislature may remain in special session, save the session of the legislature in the summer of that body. Governor Slaton opened negotiations with Messrs. King & Spaulding with a view to gaining the time to call a special session of the legislature, but they would not immediately give the question, regardless of the expense. Messrs. King & Spaulding declared in their reply to the governor that the state should not be placed in the position of being asked to pay the expense of a special session of the legislature in order to prevent the granting of a charter to a private railroad. They also stated that they do not, above all things, desire to be placed in the position of attempting to take advantage of the state in any particular. Governor Slaton's negotiations with the attorneys of the petitioning railroad were by means of personal interviews, the nature of which are set forth in the following letter to the governor, which letter expresses also the willingness of the railroad to wait upon the legislature.

Letter to the Governor.
"Hon. John M. Slaton, Executive Office, State Capitol, Atlanta, Ga.—Dear Sir: We have had under consideration the request made by you for a personal interview with a member of our firm that we might be able to discuss the issuance of a certificate of incorporation to the North Georgia Mineral railway until after the general assembly in the summer of 1915. In this connection we have also had under consideration your statement that you were being asked to call an extra session of the legislature in order that we could be heard."

Detroit, Mich., October 14.—Setting the old-time hymns to tunes that favor of the modern music hall, or of "Ragtime Doodle," was denounced by Bishop Edward W. Osborne, of Springfield, Ill., at a meeting here today of the synod of the Fifth Province of the Protestant Episcopal church in the United States. GEORGIA BANKERS WILL HELP RAISE \$150,000,000 FUND

At Meeting of Bankers Held Yesterday Cotton Loan Fund Is Approved and Immediate Action Is Recommended.

COMMITTEE PLANS TO RAISE \$10,000,000

Meeting Is Attended by Nearly 100 of the Most Prominent Bankers of the State, All of Whom Approve.

Georgia has joined the \$150,000,000 cotton loan fund, and is among the first of the eleven states to express her approval of it.

The Atlanta Clearing House association, the Georgia Bankers' association, the Georgia branch of the National Currency association, at their joint meeting yesterday, unanimously approved the raising of the \$150,000,000 cotton loan fund to be loaned in the south on cotton. They recommended immediate action on the same and appointed a joint committee from the Atlanta Clearing House association and the Georgia Bankers' association to formulate a plan for raising the fund.

The plan agreed upon. According to the plan formulated by the committee, meeting yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Georgia's quota of the syndicate will be raised through each bank in the state subscribing an amount in proportion to its capital, surplus and deposits, and the Georgia Bankers' association will use its influence to perfect necessary arrangements.

The resolutions endorsing the cotton loan fund followed due consideration of the proposition. There were seventy-three bankers present, these representing the leading banks in each section of the state, coming in response to a call made up by the Georgia Bankers' association, the Georgia Clearing House association and the Atlanta Clearing House association. Representatives of the three organizations met at the Georgia Bankers' association, 12 G. Council chairman.

Mr. Colles, vice president of the Georgia Bankers' association, presided over the meeting yesterday. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the cotton loan fund, as formulated by Felix Wade, Jr. of St. Louis, approved by the secretary of the treasury and finally approved and acted upon by a group of the leading bankers of the country, appointed by Secretary McAdoo, was explained by A. P. Colles.

Mr. Colles, while recommending the plan, believed that there were certain details which should be considered before the plan was adopted. Distinct Gain Is Claimed For Anglo-French Forces Against German Raid

Invaders Will Probably Occupy Ostend, But They Will Be Desperately Resisted in Attempting to Extend Their Lines to Northern French Ports—British Troops Were Prominent in Fighting Which Resulted in Throwing Back German Right—Russians Have Pushed Back the Germans From Warsaw—Turkey and Portugal Preparing to Enter the War.

London, October 14.—The official press bureau tonight issued the following statement:

"British troops have been engaged with the enemy towards the left of the allied line (in France), with the result that the Germans have been pressed back slightly on their flank. "The nature of the country in which the fighting has been conducted, being a mining center, makes rapid progress difficult."

Germans Foiled in Attempt To Turn Allied Left Wing

London, October 14.—While it fully is expected the Germans will reach Ostend and other ports in the northwest of Belgium, if they have not done so already, they will meet a stubborn resistance in their attempt to extend the right wing of their main army through Pas de Calais to the French northern ports. In fact they have fallen back in this region in the face of the allies' offensive.

A few days ago German cavalry were fighting as far west as Hazebrouck and Cassel, but today, according to the French official communications, this battle extends from Le Basses through Metzures to Bailleul on the Belgian frontier, while across the border the allies have occupied Ypres. For the allies.

This is a distinct gain for the allies and shows that the German attempt to work around their left has failed, the German right being bent back toward Lille and Courmel, both of which places the invaders hold with strong forces.

It is here the heavy blows, which both sides hope will bring about a decisive result in the long-drawn-out battle, will be struck. It is for this reason that the Germans will be able to make their way to Ostend, although even there some troops have been left to inflict what damage they can before joining the larger body further south. The censorship has prohibited any mention of the operations to the north of Ypres, which probably is responsible for the belief that the allies have prepared what one military critic declares is "a smashing blow, which will

NO GOVERNMENT HELP FOR COTTON GROWERS

Chairman Glass Tells Bankers That Congress Will Reject the Proposed Schemes.

Richmond, Va., October 14.—Chairman Glass, of the house banking and currency committee, told the convention of the American Bankers' association today he felt confident that proposals for government valuation of cotton or the sale of government bonds to take the crop off the planters' hands would not result in action by congress.

If it were done, he declared, it would not be of permanent benefit to the cotton producer.

Outlining some recent legislative history, he said it often was "more important to prevent things from being done than to do things."

"Especially is this true," he declared, "with reference to some of the proposals for cotton loans, such as the suggestion to have the government go into the cotton business by valuating the crop at the expense of the American taxpayer."
