



Georgia's bankers, in their meeting here yesterday, very promptly and unhesitatingly agreed to do their part in making up the \$160,000,000 cotton loan pool which, recambly originated at a meeting of financiers in \$8t. Louis, has met with response and approval so widespread that there appears up doubt of its early completion.

The Georgia's nakers met this situation as they have every crisis or emergency which has demanded their consideration and assistance. They gave their indorsement to the plan and made provision for the rainty, early of the original subscription of nearly \$10,000,000 through the officers of the Georgia Bankers' association. Atlanta's share in this loan fund will be \$3,000,000, or more than one third of it. The Atlanta bankers may be counted upon not only to do their part, but to do it promptly.

Through this cotton loan fund which, it is decided, shall be in active operation by November 1, we have at last a plan which promises a substantial measure of reside.
