Allied Fleet Rains Hurricane of Shells On the Dardanelles

Great Britain, France and Russia Lose No Time in Giving Turkey a Taste of War—British Warship Destroys Turkish Base on the Red Sea—Turkish Cabinet Is Divided Against Itself.

Dover, November 4.—(Via London, 12:30 a. m.)—The report is circulated that the German fleet has come out from its base. It is also reported from Dunkirk that four battleships and four cruisers have put to sea from Kiel.

Servia Puts Ban on Turkey

London, November 3.—"A Constantinople dispatch states that Servia today severed diplomatic relations with Turkey and the Serbian ambassador asked for his passports," says the Rome correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph company.

Allied Fleet Shells Dardanelles

London, November 3.—(Shells.)—The secretary of the admiralty announces that a combined British and French squadron bombarded the Dardanelles forts at long range at daybreak this morning. The forts replied, but no ships were hit, only one shot falling alongside them. The statement adds that the damage to the forts cannot be estimated, but that a great explosion, accompanied by dense volumes of black smoke, occurred at the Holles fort.

TURKEY DIVIDED AGAINST HERSELF.

A state of war exists between Turkey on the one side and Russia, Great Britain and Servia on the other, yet the Ottoman government appears as a house divided against itself, one section seemingly desiring war while the conservatives are trying to smooth over the situation arising from the attacks on Russian ports and ships by Turkish war vessels directed by German officers.

Russia apparently has welcomed the war and will not give the Turks a chance to draw back while the British cruiser Minerva has anchored the Turkish base of operations against Egypt at the head of the gulf of Akabah. The Turkish ambassador in London has as yet made no arrangements to leave and the embassy still maintaining a conciliatory attitude.

After twenty-four hours of uncertainty, during which hope was expressed that the Porte might make amends for the incidents in the Black Sea, the British admiralty announced shortly before 1 o'clock this afternoon that a British warship had bombarded and had destroyed the Turkish barracks at Akabah, on the Turco-Egyptian frontier.

GERMANS SERVE AS QUASI-TURKS. It was at Akabah that Turkish cavalry patrols were reported yesterday preparatory to moving into Egypt. There the British found soldiers apparently under German service.

An apology from the grand vizier for Turkish attacks on Russian ports, and doubt as to who held the whip hand in the military government, were factors which, it was stated, seemed to carry such weight as to make Turkey hesitate.

It is believed that the British are convinced that Germany was responsible for the attack on Akabah, and that the British are determined to leave the embassy still maintaining a conciliatory attitude.

BRITAIN READY TO GUARD EGYPT. 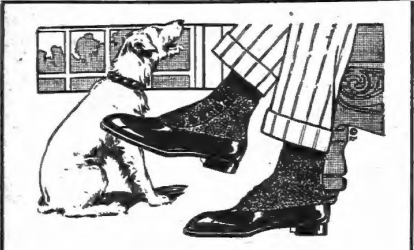

GEORGIA FARMERS GREATLY INCREASE CROPS OF GRAINS

Atlanta, Ga., November 2.—(Special.)—From reports received by State Agent A. Phil Gorman, of the College of Agriculture, that nearly three times as much small grain, and nearly twice as much corn, was raised in Georgia this year as ever before. These reports were received from the agents working in about seventy counties.

Much of the seedling has been done on cotton fields, the grain being put between the cotton rows. More of this would have been done by this time, it is reported by the agents, were the cotton growers further along with their cotton-picking. They will not put in the grain between the cotton rows until the loose cotton has been picked.
