

STANDARD REVIEW GEORGES BAR OUTS, STATES ATKINSON

Heads of Georgia Railway and Power Company Declare That a Policy of Retrenchment is Necessary.

PETITIONS ARE FOUGHT BY PROMINENT CITIZENS

Better Times Are Near, and There is No Reason for Reduction of Service, They Tell Commission.

In presenting the final plan of the Georgia Railway and Power company whose petition to discontinue certain extra car services on fourteen different lines was heard by the state railroad commission on Wednesday and rigorously protested in person by more than one hundred citizens, H. E. Atkinson, vice president of the corporation, declared before the commission that, owing to the falling off of the revenues of the company in the last several months, retrenchment is necessary.

The argument for both sides was concluded on Wednesday and the commission took the matter under advisement. At the opening of the hearing Wednesday morning President Preston Arkwright of the street car and power company stated that during the last three or four months of 1914 the average decrease in revenues under the corresponding months of 1913 was over \$100,000 per month.

The hearing was productive of many vigorous protests, most of the protesters declaring that they are not now receiving the service they should receive and that the proposal to reduce this service is ample cause for indignation. It was also declared that the street car company was taking a pessimistic view of the outlook, and is filing its retrenchment petition just at a time when the citizens of Atlanta are endeavoring to continue their present services.

Atkinson stated as follows: "I do not know that I should mention this matter in this connection, Mr. Chairman. But the expenditures of the company last year were over \$1,000,000 in cash for hydro-electric developments.

"We feel that conditions confronting us are serious. Therefore we ask that you will grant this petition so far as you possibly can. If you cannot do so, we have to ask your consent we would be forced to do this in an hour. The granting of this petition would have a most favorable effect upon the financial centers where we must go for help. Whatever may be your decision in this matter, we will abide by it cheerfully."

Mr. Atkinson declared that he could not successfully be a pessimist, but that he believes improvement of conditions will be slow this year. "We do not want to make these reductions in service," he said, "but if it is the only thing left for us to do, we will do it. We are not asking for an abatement of a fight against the petition of the company and stated that it seemed to him more like a business and a decrease in the service, as against the same periods of 1913, and as against other form of service.

SALOON BUSINESS ON DOWN GRADE IN NEW YORK STATE

### TERROR REIGNED IN ROME.

There was confusion throughout the whole of Rome. In some cases it amounted to terror and bordered on panic. The telephone was resorted to by great numbers of people at virtually the same time in endeavors to ascertain the safety of relatives, friends, and then to learn the extent of the damage to the city. The telephone girls did their best to meet the emergency. A system of gathering and giving information was hurriedly inaugurated.

It was learned early in the day that among the old buildings damaged was the Palazzo Chigi, as well as the famous column of Marcus Aurelius.

Historic buildings on the Piazza Colonna in the center of Rome, also were damaged, as was also the famous Farnese Palace, occupied by the French embassy. The piece of the stone cornice had fallen.

The bellry of the Church of St. Andrea is in danger of falling, and the building has been surrounded by police to prevent people from approaching it.

REPUBLICAN GUNS TURNED ON WILSON

President Bitterly Attacked by G. O. P. Senators—Democrats Predict Renomination and Re-election of Wilson.

Washington, January 13.—One of the liveliest debates of the present congress stirred the senate today when republican leaders launched a vigorous attack on President Wilson's Indianapolis speech, the administration's Mexican policy and democratic legislation. Democrats met the attack with praise for the president and a prediction of his re-election.

The debate was precipitated over Senator Cummins' resolution asking the president to indicate what the government proposed to do with Mexican customs collected during the occupation of Vera Cruz. Action on the resolution was postponed until tomorrow.

Senator John Sharp Williams, one of those who repudiated republican criticism of the administration, declared with emphasis that President Wilson would be renominated and re-elected for the presidency, because "the American people have found him not only able to take the place of men about whom they were quarreling, but good enough to stand in his own stead."

You cannot embarrass the administration or belittle the American people with any such resolution, said Mr. Williams, who was speaking in support of the president's policy. He declared if "a certain American" had been in the white house there would have been no stern messages to congress climaxed with "come on here, change."

FOR TWO BATTLESHIPS AND MANY AUXILIARIES

Washington, January 13.—Provision for construction of two great dreadnoughts, six torpedo boat destroyers, sixteen coast defense submarines, a new battleship, a hospital ship, a transport and a fuel ship at an aggregate cost of \$31,161,512 is made in the naval appropriation bill approved on Tuesday by the house naval committee. All told the bill carries \$145,000,000, of which \$22,941,512 is for new construction.

The construction program falls far below plans urged by Representative Hobson and other big navy advocates. It includes the two battleships asked for by Secretary Daniels and provides for more auxiliaries than the chairman had predicted. The program proposes the building of two battleships at not more than \$10,000,000 each, exclusive of armament. Six torpedo boat destroyers at not more than \$1,000,000 each, exclusive of armament. One sea-going submarine at not more than \$1,400,000, exclusive of armament. Two submarines at not more than \$1,000,000 each. One hospital ship at not more than \$2,500,000.

Representative Hobson gave notice that he would carry to the floor of the house the bill for three battleships, two battle cruisers and six destroyers and submarines. The bill's appropriation was estimated by the department at \$30,000,000, but it was pointed out that it was exceeded by appropriations for a battleship being built from proceeds of the sale of the old battleships Mississippi and Alaska.

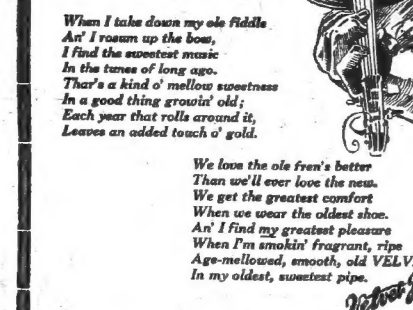
