

CLUBS OF ATLANTA ARE OBEDIING LAW, ASSERT OFFICIALS

Statements Are Given Out by Leading Clubmen Following Notice Served on Monday by Police Chief.

WILL MAKE NO CHANGES IN METHODS OF SERVICE

Near Beer Ordinance Has Been Enforced All Along, Says Beavers—Mayson Construes Locker Law.

Official of Atlanta's leading social clubs last night declared that these institutions were being conducted lawfully and that there will be no necessity for any change in service following Chief Beavers' order issued yesterday, insisting that the law must strictly enforce the law after May 1.

In his talk to the club heads the chief calls attention to the construction of the city ordinance governing locker clubs and the state locker club law, by City Attorney James L. Mayson.

Beer Law Enforced.

When asked last night why he intended maintaining a crusade against the near beer saloons of Atlanta, Chief Beavers would have nothing to say. He intimated, though, that if any of his officers reported to him that the near beer saloons were selling beer, he would take action. There have been many such cases made by the police and tried in the courts, said Chief Beavers.

The near beer ordinance has been enforced all along.

Obeying Law—Gentry.

W. G. Gentry, president of the Capital City Club, said to a reporter: "The Constitution in regard to Chief Beavers' order to the locker clubs that they must comply strictly with the law after May 1,"

Chief Beavers did not say, on many occasions and a copy of his order to the locker clubs, I understand from the reporter, though that the city ordinance governing locker clubs and the state locker club law, is the same as the one in effect in the city ordinance governing locker clubs and the state locker club law.

The Driftwood Club has always tried to adhere strictly to the provisions of the state's new law and always will.

The Driftwood Club, he said, has never done a scheme which was arranged by a number of prominent lawyers, who are not members of the club, to get out of the law. Every year the Driftwood Club tries to observe the law.


Not Operated for Profit.

Where French Are Hammering German Wedge

In an effort to dislodge the Germans from St. Mihel, a salient point on the Meuse River, the French are conducting a sustained and somewhat formidable offensive between the Meuse and the Moselle.
