

had captured the town of Mosowka. Army headquarters today gave the following:

"The French yesterday suffered a fresh defeat. In spite of their heavy losses on June 13 they continued to fight to break through the line between Levin and Arna, with great stubbornness. The French attack, carried out with large forces in close formation, broke down everywhere with the heaviest losses under the fire of our troops.

"Northwest of Moulou-Sou-Touvent we have not yet succeeded in regaining portions of the trenches lost by us on June 6. In Champagne, north of Perthes and Les Mesnil fighting continues, but the enemy is unable to gain the advantage.

"Yesterday the open town of Karlsruhe, far from the theater of operations and not in any way fortified,

was attacked with bombs dropped by hostile aircraft. So far as is now known some eleven citizens were killed and six injured. Military damage could not have been caused. One aircraft of the enemy was brought down by one of our military aircraft and the occupants were killed. Another enemy aircraft was observed to land near Schirrmann.

"Eastern theater: Shavli German troops stormed the village of Daneske and took 1,450 prisoners. The positions recently won southeast and east of the Marais-les-Bains were again attacked yesterday by a strong enemy force, which had no success.

"Our troops advanced on the Liepvre-Kalvary front, pressed back the Russian line, and captured the Russian advanced trenches. On the River Orny our attacking troops stormed and took the village of Gedorosce, southeast

of Chreston and Cserwanahors and the bridge east of that place. The booty amounted to 367 Russian prisoners.

"Attacks by the enemy against the point at which we broke through north of Solimur were repulsed.

"Southeastern theater: The enemy who was defeated on June 13 and 14 by the army of General Mackensen has been unable to regain a footing in the positions previously won. The positions recently won by the army of General Mackensen have been forced to retreat. The troops of General von Der Marwitz yesterday took Mocsika.

"The right wing of the army of General Linington stormed the heights east of Zabol. Our cavalry reached the district south of Mariampol."

AIRMAN RAID

KARLSRUHE. Karlsruhe, Baden, June 15.—(Via London.)—Five hostile airmen bombed Karlsruhe for 45 minutes this morning. Several persons were killed or wounded.

A number of places suffered material damage, but the destruction wrought has no military importance.

Karlsruhe is on the Rhine about 15 miles from the French frontier. It has a population of about 100,000 and a number of public buildings of importance.

GAINS HELD BY FRENCH.

Paris, June 15.—Tonight's official war office statement says that the French have held their gains in the region to the north of Arras—in the sectors of Lorette and Neuville—and to

the south of Arna, at the Tontout farm. All the German counter attacks were repulsed and we have maintained our gains.

"The north of Neuville we have taken possession of several German positions.

"The point which has been marked in these two regions only by an artillery counter-battery has been violently attacked by the German troops.

"The enemy on the railway between the night of June 14 and 15 against the positions which we captured on June 13. The enemy was repulsed. On the rest of the front there is no change.

"In retaliation for the bombardment of the station of Liepvre, which has been open since the order was given on June 13, the German capital of the Grand Duchy of Baden was shelled on the morning of 21 aeroplanes set out for Karlsruhe.

"Although caught by a northeast wind, the aeroplanes over the town between 7:30 and 8:30 o'clock. They dropped 130 projectiles of 40 and 100 caliber on the objects which had been marked. Many fires broke out during the time the aeroplanes were flying overhead. The aeroplanes were flying in a westerly direction, proceeding in an easterly direction.

VIENNA CLAIMS.

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AUSTRIANS MASS AGAINST ITALIANS

Strong Forces Sent to Oppose Invasion of the Trentino—Italians Pounding With Heavy Artillery.

London, June 15.—The Italian invasion of Trentino, which has been met with little opposition, now is challenged by the Austrians. A force of 15,000 Austrians left Trento yesterday and is advancing against the Italians in the direction of the Trentino.

Heavy fighting has occurred on the Isonzo front, north of the Gulf of Trieste. Italian heavy artillery has begun the bombardment of Malborghetto, one of the pilots of the Austrians has been killed. The Austrians have advanced to the Isonzo river, Tarvis, an important railroad junction twelve miles further east, also is threatened.

ITALIANS USING HEAVY ARTILLERY.

On the Italian Front, June 15.—(Via Chisasso and Paris.)—The Italian heavy artillery apparently has been left comparatively undisturbed for a day or two and consequently they have been pounding away with their heavy artillery all along the Trentino, Carnate and the Tyrolia front. They have been attacking forts which dominate important roads and which Austria has spent the winter in modernizing and strengthening.

Italian army officers claim excellent results have been obtained which promise to open the way shortly for an infantry advance in force.

Many of the prisoners falling into Italian hands say they come from the Serbian front.

SUCCESSES CLAIMED BY THE ITALIANS.

Rome, June 15.—(Via Paris.)—The following official statement was issued at the headquarters of the Italian general staff:

"There have been no important developments along the Tyrol-Trentino front. The enemy persistently attacked Montellone at night after an all day bombardment from Forte Piaz and Wies, but was repulsed each time. Heavy fighting occurred recently in the vicinity of Gerz and Gradisca where fighting occurred recently. The Austrians caused the explosion of ammunition depots towards Corle and the explosion of the railway station damaged the enemy's works at Cesana.

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SUBMARINE DESTROYS VESSEL AND HER CREW

Only Four Men of the Argyll Escape—Norway Steamer Duranger Sunk.

London, June 15.—The British trawler Argyll was torpedoed and sunk today by a German submarine. Of the crew of 11 only four were saved. They were landed at Harwich, on the east coast.

The Argyll was sent to the bottom without warning and went down in less than two minutes.

London, June 15.—Advice received here from Stornoway, Scotland, says the Norwegian steamer Duranger, formerly the Norwegian steamer Olyn, has been torpedoed and sunk by a submarine off the Hebrides Islands. The crew of 31 arrived today at Stornoway. The Duranger was 335 feet long, 2,180 tons gross.

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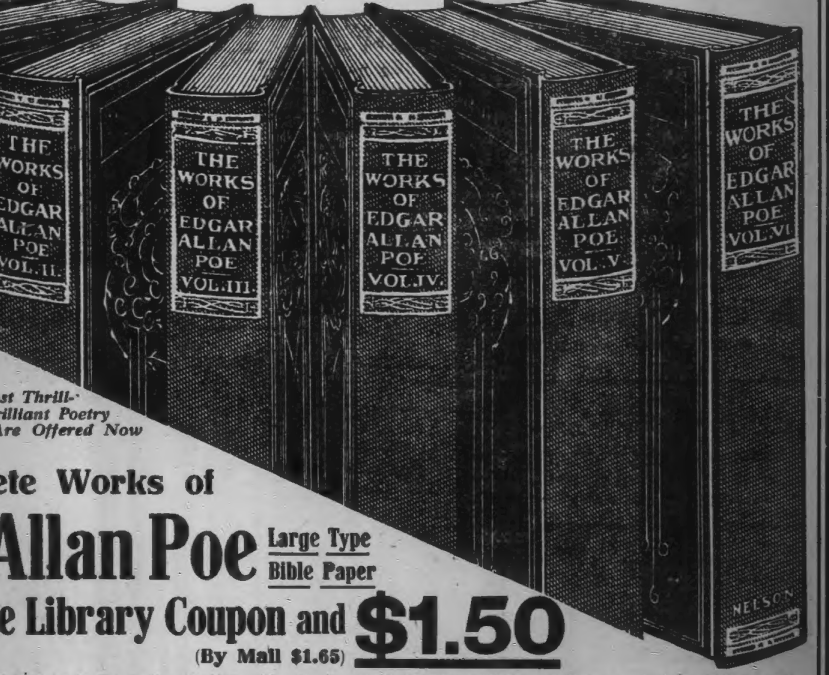
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
