Harris County Deeply Stirred by Discovery of the Bodies of Epps and Max Melton and Johnny Leake in Chattahoochee River.

FATHER OF MELTONS ALLEGES SONS KILLED AS RESULT OF A PLOT

Murder Striving of Bitter Feud of Long Standing, Declares Attorney Walter McKinney—Father Is Sure Boys Put Up a Desperate Fight.

West Point, Ga., July 1.—(Special.)—The details of a midnight auto ride through the country, upon which the father of the slain boys, Epps and Max Melton, was urged in vain to go, will be unfolded before the coroner's jury in the continuance of the inquest into the triple tragedy which followed the bodies were taken from the muddy waters of the Chattahoochee.

Walter McKinney, special counsel engaged by Tony Melton, the father, stated tonight that summons had been issued to Johnny Leake and Schaefer and Charley Hargett, three farmers living near River View, Ala., who admit having carried the three victims in the auto tour of Columbus, where they were last seen alive. They will appear at Friday's session of the inquest and relate the details of the trip and the incidents that culminated in the deaths of the three victims.

LONG AUTO RIDE

The inquest was abruptly discontinued tonight when it was learned that the slain men had been on the automobile trip. It is understood that Land and the Hargetts are willing to testify in the inquest of the trip, they have any knowledge of the murders.

"Further than learning the actions of the victims on the night it is believed they were murdered—Sunday—we expect to find clues which will show a plot to slay the three boys as the result of a bitter feud of long standing. We have evidence already that such theories exist."

FEUD CHARGED

Land lived within a radius of a mile of the plantation of Alexander Teal, a prominent planter, in the vicinity of which Melton was acquitted on a plea of self-defense. This slaying, itself, is said to have culminated from a feud between the Teal and Melton families. A hand-to-hand encounter between Teal and Epps Melton, the midnight slaying of the latter, the frequent threats and a continued personal armament were incidents that led up to the Teal slaying.

SEARCH FOR MURDER SCENE

The bodies were discovered separately. That of Epps Melton was found clinging to a tree line at Houston bridge, a spot less than a mile from West Point. A subsequent search for his missing brother revealed the
