along the Gulla Lipa from Firilow southward, according to an official statement given out tonight by the Austrian war office. The statement follows:

"After many days of bitter fighting General von Lindner's army has driven the Russians from their strong positions along the Gulla Lipa southward from Firilow. The enemy is retreating eastward and is pursued along the whole front. The enemy has suffered heavy losses, 1,943 men and eighteen machine guns being captured.

"Northward the fighting continues. On the Delester, nothing of importance has occurred. In Russian Poland, on the Vistula and the Bug, we are combating a strong Russian force and also on the Por and Brok and Wyzmic sectors. Our armies are attacking everywhere.

"Westward from the Vistula river we attacked hostile positions north of Tarnow this afternoon, subsequently progressing within striking distance of other parts of the front and at night capturing the Russians, who were repulsed in Russian positions, the enemy fled. Pursuing the Russians, we captured Josefow, on the Vistula. The Russians were also repulsed from positions southeast of Bienna, where we captured 100 men.

"In the Italian war theater, the Italian attacked on the Italian Debedo rapidly. After preparation by heavy guns for several hours, they launched infantry attacks between Sarcausina and Verminiano, which were repulsed with heavy loss. Feeble attacks against the British in the Gora region and at Krv were repulsed, our troops maintaining their positions. Artillery fighting continues."

RUSSIANS REPORT HARD FIGHTING.

Patrols July 2.—(Via London, July 3, 1915 a. m.)—The following official statement was given out here tonight:

"June 30 north of Przasnysz and the following night in the Szwed and the Russian regions we repulsed local attacks on the left bank of the Vistula the enemy on Thursday delivered heavy attacks on the front of Bienna-Josefow. In the direction of Labin the enemy is in contact with us along the Szwed and Wyzmic and Por. Between the Vozna and Bug rivers the enemy continues to progress towards the north and northeast.

"In the region north of Szamota on Thursday there was a stubborn street fighting. A regiment of Prussian

plans made, which had seized the village of Jozkoff, was dislodged by our counter-attacks.

"On the Gokai-Balics front the enemy on Wednesday and all of Thursday morning delivered numerous attacks most of which were repulsed, inflicting heavy losses on the enemy. During our counter-attacks we took over 4,000 prisoners and captured several machine guns. Nevertheless, the Russian forces succeeded Thursday evening in establishing themselves on the left bank of the Gulla Lipa.

"There is no change on the Delester river."

TEUTON FORCES STILL ADVANCE.

Berlin, July 2.—(Via London.)—The German forces have reached the Russian positions at Kramnik, in the southernmost part of the front, according to the official statement issued today by the German army headquarters. The statement also says that the Russian forces in the region west of Szamota have been driven back.

"Western theater:—A night attack on our positions west of Bourbes was beaten off. In the western portion of the front, northwest of Le Four de Paris we advanced by storm over a front of kilometers (3 miles) and from 300 to 400 meters wide. This was carried out by the 27th and 28th troops. Twenty-five officers and 1,715 men were made prisoners. Eighteen machine guns, 40 mine throwers and one revolver cannon were captured. French losses were important.

"In the Vosges our positions were taken by an enemy force. Attempts by the enemy to recapture it were repulsed. Three officers and 149 men fell into our hands.

"Eastern theater:—Southwest of Kalwarka after stubborn fighting, we took a mine position from the enemy and captured 600 Russians.

"Southern theater:—After storming the heights southeast of Bukanoska, north of Bialic, the Russians along the whole front

FIVE VESSELS ARE SUNK BY GERMAN SUBMARINES

British Steamers Caucasian, Inglemore and Welbury Among the Victims.

London, July 3.—Three British steamers, the Caucasian, Inglemore and Welbury, the bark Gasconard and the schooner L. C. Tower were reported today to have been sunk by German submarines in the vicinity of the British Isles and off South Ireland.

The Caucasian met her fate southeast of Lisard Head, on the coast of Cornwall, on Thursday morning. While engaged in picking up her crew the Inglemore fell a victim to the same submarine.

Steamer tried to escape. The Caucasian, when the submarine opened fire, was given full steam in an endeavor to escape. Not until the steamer was struck by several shots, did her captain surrender. The crew then hauled alongside and fired eight shots into the vessel. A dog belonging to the captain of the Caucasian jumped aboard and the captain planned from one of the boats into the rough sea and rescued his pet.

Yesterday evening the Germans after intense artillery preparation, attacked our position, on Hillenfrat (in the Vosges) a series of attacks, the first of which were repulsed. In the course of the third attack the enemy gained a foothold in our works. Through a counter-attack we recaptured this morning all our positions, which the Germans are continuing to shell with their heavy guns.

In the Dardanelles after the successful capture of the Turkish troops on June 28, the Turks attempted violent counter-attacks. They were repulsed with heavy losses.

On June 30 we carried a Turkish including six successive lines of trenches. The ground is covered with dead Turkish soldiers. We have not been counter-attacked."
