

FIGURING FRAGILE, RUSSIANS ARE FIGHTING BACK

At Several Points the Counter Attacks of Russians Have Stopped the Advance of Germans.

WARSAW NOT YET TAKEN BY THE KAISER'S FORCES

But This Climax to the German Offensive Is Expected Hourly—Germans Fighting Hard to Hold Positions in the West.

London, August 1.—The anniversary of the outbreak passed without the Germans occupying Warsaw, and to be part of their program. However, news of this climax to the German offensive in the east is expected hourly, for what little information is allowed to leak through declares the Warsaw correspondent that the German army is making good their retreat.

COUNTER ATTACKS BY THE RUSSIANS.

These rear guard actions have developed into fairly large battles, as the Russians, whose steel helmets have been seen in the hands of the Germans, are offering stubborn resistance and delivering powerful counter attacks. They have prevented Field Marshal von Hindenburg from throwing some of his troops across the Narow, and repulsed German attacks northwest of Warsaw.

In the southern Field Marshal von Mackensen continues his victorious advance. He has swept aside the resistance of the Russians and forced them to retreat along both banks of the Bug.

RUSSIANS STOP GERMAN ADVANCE.

During the month of July Berlin says the Germans captured the city of Brest. The Russians, according to Petrograd, have stopped General von Zuehlow's advance in the direction of the Brest-Litovsk railway.

FRENCH MARINES LAND AT PORT AU PRINCE

Washington, August 1.—French marines were landed at Port au Prince, Haiti, where a revolution that overthrew the government had been precipitated by the landing of an expeditionary force from the United States.

GERMANS ATTACK ON WEST FRONT.

Meanwhile the Germans, who appear to have an inexhaustible supply of munitions, are fighting desperately to obtain every position they hold in the west. They have captured part of the line from the front to the rear, and are trying to regain what they lost to the French in the Meuse river region.

AT BLOODY COST TEUTONS ADVANCE.

Geneva, Switzerland, August 1.—(Via Paris).—The capture of Lubin cost General von Mackensen 70,000 men in killed, wounded and prisoners. Four miles north of Lubin the Russians are fighting fiercely, disputing every foot of ground while covering their retreat.
