

Many Persons Drowned When River Overflows; Hundreds Are Homeless

Thousands of Pleasure Resorts and Summer Cottages Are Swept Away Near St. Louis. HUNDRED SQUARE MILES IN THE FLOODED AREA

Twenty Persons Known to Be Dead, and the Final List May Aggregate Several More—Many People Take Refuge in Trees.

St. Louis, August 22.—The Meramec river, lined on either side with thousands of pleasure resorts, clubhouses and summer cottages, went several miles out of its banks today, sweeping away most of these buildings and increasing to twenty, it is reported, the number of lives lost in St. Louis county as a result of floods which followed the recent rainstorm here.

The Meramec began rising a foot an hour this morning and the flow was so sudden that hundreds had time only to climb trees. Efforts to rescue these with motor boats had been vain early tonight.

The river tonight passed a stage five feet higher than ever known before. Deaths today were three.

Six persons were said to have been drowned at Valley Park and two at Meramec Highlands today. Many others were missing and fear is expressed that the death list may aggregate several score persons.

Hundreds of persons had been drowned in clubhouses and cottages along the river by the first rise several days ago, and hundreds of others had gone to the river today hoping it would recede and permit them to return to their friends and their water-soaked possessions.

Searches for help were sent to St. Louis tonight and hundreds of volunteers immediately responded. Boats were being rubbed to the Meramec by train. Strong motor boats attempted to enter the Meramec from the Mississippi Park and about a dozen families have been made homeless. The water was ten to twelve feet high in the city.

The flooded area is estimated at one-half square mile. Telephone and telegraph wires to all towns in this district are down. Thousands of persons in the flooded districts are being housed in churches, hotels and other public buildings. Cots and food are being sent from St. Louis.

Officials warned Valley Park residents to leave their homes last night, but many refused. When swirling waters rushed into the town at 6 o'clock this morning the exodus began. Many were forced to flee in their night clothes.

One family refused to move this morning because the stove was expected. The family moved to the second floor of the house, and two hours later the water was five feet high. The family fled in row boats as the water began to rise in the room and the stove and her babe were taken out through a window.

Meramec Park and other towns were without light or drinking water to night. Darkness came on the marooned in club houses discharged firearms to attract attention of rescuers. It became apparent before daylight that many of those who had sought refuge in the trees would have to be rescued at night there or swim to one of the few high houses which had not been washed away. Few seemed willing to risk their lives in such an attempt.

It is believed every acre of corn in the Meramec and Bourbeuse valleys has been ruined. Property Damage Heavy. Poplar Springs, Mo., tonight reported property damage aggregating \$1,000,000. Floods here within 10 miles and having inundated twenty towns, today began to recede.

Railroad traffic has been at a standstill since Friday. Trains in Missouri were isolated tonight. The water is still high in the town of Hannibal, Mo., at Lutesville, St. Louis bound train which left Charleston yesterday morning was caught between two washouts and has been marooned ever since. Thousands of acres of farm lands in Green and Jersey counties, Illinois, were flooded today when the Green county levees were washed out.

The Missouri levee broke near Jerseyville, and the water, it is feared, will cover 10,000 acres of farm land. Residents of the district were warned, and it is believed there has been no loss of life there.

The situation is clouded with considerable uncertainty. "King Constantine has asked Venezelos to form a new ministry, but to continue the old policy," says The Graphic's correspondent.

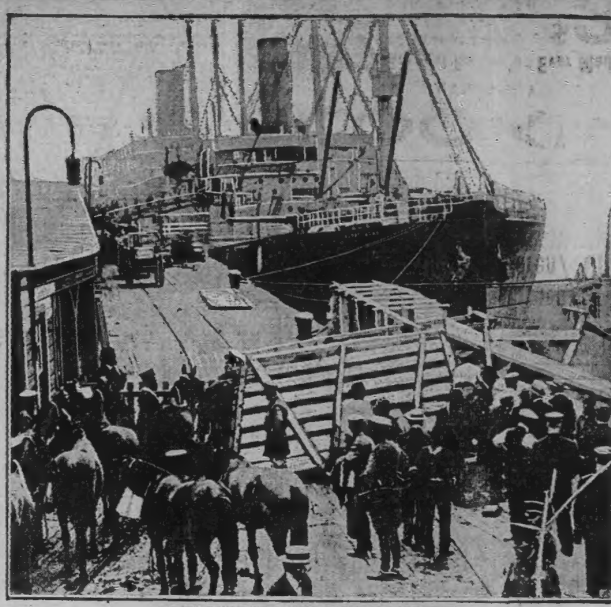

British Transport Sunk With 1,000 Soldiers



ROYAL EDWARD LOADED FOR HER LAST TRIP. The British transport Royal Edward has been torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine. Announcement of this effect has been made officially. Six hundred men were saved out of 1,350 troops and 250 other persons on board. The sinking of the Royal Edward has shattered the tradition of the British navy of having transported hundreds of thousands of men across the seas without the destruction of a troopship. On two previous occasions transports have been attacked. The wayfarer was torpedoed by a submarine in the Irish sea, but the vessel was not sunk and only five lives were lost. The Mantou was attacked by a Turkish torpedo boat in the Aegean sea, although the ship was not damaged, four lives were lost through the breaking of a davit as a boat was being lowered. The loss of the Royal Edward is a serious one at this moment. The men it carried were not part of a new expedition, but were reinforcements for the Twenty-ninth division, which has been on the Gallipoli peninsula since the first landing and which received such high praise from General Hamilton in his report on the initial and subsequent operations. The Royal Edward was 11,117 tons gross and 526 feet long. She was owned by the Canadian Northern Steamship company, of Toronto. She was built in Glasgow in 1908.
