



Sculptor's Letter Suggests Scheme for U. D. C. Monument

Mrs. C. Helen Plana, president of the Stone Mountain Memorial Association of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, received yesterday a letter from Gustav Borglum, the sculptor, who has been selected to draw a design for the monument they propose to establish to the heroes of the confederacy, at Stone Mountain.

Mrs. Borglum's letter is written after his first visit to the mountain, his conference with Mrs. Plana, Mr. Samuel H. Venable and others patriotically interested in the project, and is in part as follows:

"Stone Mountain is a sound unbroken mass of gray granite, with uniform surface and suitable for colossal monumental work. Had Egypt or Greece possessed a mountain of such sound building material they would have shaped the entire mountain into a temple to their deity, their civilization, that would have made it not the eighth, but the first wonder of the world, uniting the products of civilization with the phenomena of nature.

"The present condition of the surface granite of the mountain, and this means the condition of the material to be sculptured, is the best argument for the permanency and endurance of the monument.

"I shall recommend that no building be constructed on the mountain, that the monumental work upon the mountain be of such a character that it can be seen directly into the mountain itself. This is not only because of permanency, but also because it would insure conformity to the character and nature of the mountain and would also insure the proper scale of the work. All work must be colossal and of such proportions as to be seen easily and understood, at a distance of one-half to one and a half miles.

"My report to you later will contain suggestions as to methods of doing the work, time possibly necessary, use of the best machinery, and the best lands directly below. I shall return to Atlanta for several weeks, to plan the material for my plans and to report which of the monuments will be presented later to the United Daughters of the Confederacy, the message to be taken there by Mrs. Walter Lewis, president of the Georgia division, U. D. C."
