County Officers Puzzled By Mysterious Shooting Of Woman in Man's Room

Mrs. John Montgomery Refuses to Tell Why Fred Warfield Attacked Her While She Was in His Father's Room at Hotel Florence.

POLICE BELIEVE SON RESENTED RELATIONS OF FATHER AND WOMAN
Warfield is Wealthy Stockman of Elizabethtown, Ky., and Is Well Known in Atlanta Live Stock Market. Woman Is Mystery to the Detectives.

County policemen are making a thorough investigation of circumstances leading up to the mysterious shooting of Mrs. John Montgomery Sunday morning at the Hotel Florence, in the suite of Frederick Warfield, wealthy stockman of Elizabethtown, Ky., and one of the leading figures in the Atlanta live stock market.

Inquiry is being made into the stockman's personal relations with the woman shot by his son, Fred, aged 22, who departed Sunday afternoon for Elizabethtown, Ky., his home. His father resided in the city.

Mrs. Montgomery, with a bullet hole in her foot, was transferred Monday afternoon from Grady hospital to St. Joseph's infirmary, in which latter hospital she decided to give the police authorities her correct name, after having given at least three assumed names.

REFUSES DETAILS.
She persistently refuses to reveal particulars of the shooting, and jokingly informed County Policemen Sunday morning that she had sustained the bullet wound in an automobile accident. She has employed counsel to Harvey Hill, and evidently intends to press prosecution.

RENTED ATTENTIONS.
County policemen stated last night that she had been married and that Warfield, the son, a youth who is engaged with his father in live stock business, had resented his father's alleged attentions to the Atlanta woman.

She stated that young Warfield had entered the father's bedroom Sunday morning about 1 o'clock and had demanded the woman to leave his father's room. She stated that she had fled to the lobby of the hotel, where she sat several minutes, later returning to the bedroom.

This time he is said to have made his complaint more emphatic. She was absent from the room. Mrs. Montgomery stated that she had been drinking and that she had been drinking on the night of the shooting.

No details of preceding incidents, however, could be elicited from her. Whether would she discuss her rumored relations with the stockman. Warfield has frequently sought his family to spend the winter in Atlanta, where his daughter attends art and music schools. He is the father of six children.

This Charge and That of Placing Fictitious Employee on Georgia Pay Roll Made Against E. E. Holcomb.

NEGROES AT CAPITOL DECLARE HE CHARGED THEM USURIOUS RATES

Assistant to Keeper of Public Buildings Said to Be Short in His Accounts More Than \$2,000.

HOLCOMB IS SUED.
"Dock" Mitchell, negro porter in the office of the secretary of state, yesterday filed suit in the municipal court of Atlanta to recover from E. E. Holcomb, assistant keeper of public buildings of the state, a sum approximating \$212, alleged usurious interest charged upon a loan.

It is alleged that the negro borrowed \$150 from Holcomb and that Holcomb took from his \$3.00 pay envelope each week, 1.50, or 10 per cent week interest, upon the loan. Mitchell, it is said, later borrowed another \$15, making the total loan \$165, and Holcomb then took \$20 per cent week interest upon the total sum of the interest upon this loan is alleged to have reached more than the \$300 mark before the suit was filed.

As soon as a public accountant can go over the accounts of the keeper of public buildings at the statehouse and ascertain the exact amount of a shortage charged against E. E. Holcomb, assistant to the keeper of public buildings, Mitchell is expected to bring suit against him.

The results of an investigation which has been in progress since September 1, together with the report of the public accountant upon completion of his investigation, it is understood, will be placed at the disposal of Solicitor General Hugh Dorsey, of Fulton superior court, for his criminal proceedings as he may deem proper.

YOUNGERS QUESTIONED.
Last night, Governor Harris issued an executive order requiring the original vouchers of the department of keeper of public buildings to be submitted for the purpose of being audited. It was noted that several vouchers of the trust statement—the monthly statements of the department of keeper of public buildings—made upon estimates in advance—seem to have been altered. Communication with creditors verified these alterations.

Governor Harris then ordered an investigation into the department, which has been in progress since September 1, and which has revealed manipulations of the state's funds through the office of keeper of public buildings running back as far as May 1, 1913, it is said.

These manipulations of state funds have been reported by a public accountant who was appointed to the place of assistant to the keeper of public buildings by Governor Hicks Smith in 1908, and has served continuously since with the exception of the administration of Governor Joseph M. Brown.

The total shortage charged against Mitchell amounts to \$2,242, it is said.

EVERY CENT TO BE SPENT FOR AMERICAN PRODUCTS
Money Will Be Used to Pay for Cotton, Grain, Meat, Munitions and Other Commodities Believed Washington Will Not Interfere.

UNITED STATES STANDS IN ARABIC CASE—BELIEVED EVIDENCE MAY CAUSE BERLIN TO CHANGE ATTITUDE.

New York, September 13.—The present plan of the joint Anglo-French financial commission, it was reported today, is to borrow \$100,000,000 in the United States on straight British and French government bonds without any collateral.

Whether the neutrality of the United States would be questioned in case the bankers financing the loan should accept straight government securities, has been given serious consideration. It was said financiers familiar with the plan had every reason to believe Washington would not interfere.

That was the unanimous opinion tonight of the scores of prominent bankers from New York and the chief cities of the country, who have gathered in the city for the three days of its stay in this city. As to the correctness of the members of the commission, it was believed that they had every reason to believe Washington would not interfere.

Statement by Commission Head.
All the commission agreed to publish an authoritative statement by Lord Reading, British ambassador in Washington, to the effect that the United States is in a position to make loans to the British government.

United States Stands in Arabic Case—Believed Evidence May Cause Berlin to Change Attitude.
Washington, September 13.—Conferees today heard President Wilson and Secretary Lansing and Count von Bernstorff, German ambassador, discuss the United States stand in the Arabic case.

First—The German ambassador has been furnished with the evidence of offenses and convictions of the Arabic. All agreeing that the liner was proceeding peacefully when it was seized and has been advised that the United States desires a withdrawal of the attack and preparation for the American lives lost.

Second—The evidence will be sent by Count von Bernstorff to the Berlin foreign office, to which it has not been available before, and probably today. In some quarters it is believed that the evidence will be so strong that the German government will change its position and disavow the action of the submarine commander who it was claimed in the note sank the liner because he thought she was about to attack him.

Third—The United States has at hand all information on the case as it now stands and is ready to deal upon the course, but action may be delayed until Berlin replies to Count von Bernstorff.

Arbitration of Principle.
"Fourth—While the United States will not consent to arbitration of a principle or of a question involving the safety of American lives, it has no objection to arbitration of the question of whether the submarine or whether her action justified the submarine commander in the sinking of the liner." It was stated that the German government has agreed to arbitrate the amount of indemnity to be paid by the submarine commander for the loss of the liner.

Washington, September 13.—(By Associated Press.)—A conference between Gerard and von Jagow, German ambassador, was held today.

A number of milk dealers from all over the state, who upon summons had been issued, appeared at the office of Dr. Peter F. Babson, of the state agricultural department, yesterday, to answer complaints by the department regarding impure or contaminated milk in trade.

Dr. Babson said it had been found that milk handled by these dealers contained a very high bacterial count and, in a number of cases, they were disposing of watered milk.

Columbia, S. C., September 13.—After a campaign, which started with little show of interest, but grew more lively as the election approached, South Carolina tomorrow will vote on the question of state-wide prohibition of the sale of intoxicating liquors.

RUMANIAN TROOPS BEING MOBILIZED
Albany, September 13.—It is reported in diplomatic circles here that there has been a heavy mobilization of Rumanian troops, including several regiments of cavalry, to face a unexpected concentration of Austrians, which is directed presumably against Rumania.

THE NEW SCHOOL TERM. Atlanta's public schools opened for the year's term yesterday, under more favorable promise for the future than for several years past.

With the exception of minor sources of complaint, which will be remedied in due time, the school system begins its work without a hitch, and with every prospect of a most successful year ahead.

There is some complaint about the distribution of scholars among the respective schools on the principle laid down by the board of education that every child must go to the school nearest it if there is room; if not it must go to the next nearest school.

The delay in the completion of the building for the consolidated English-Commercial High School, which it appears will not be ready for occupancy until the last part of the year, is, of course, to be regretted.

The inconvenience caused by these delays strongly emphasizes the position which the Constitution took regarding the school system in making its fight for betterments which resulted in the appropriation of \$35,000 in June, when it was apparent there was not a minute to lose, if the schools were to be fully prepared to meet the demands upon them at the fall opening.

But Georgia and the south must continue to grow cotton. It is the great natural product of the section. If the producers of it, however, will all learn first to live at home and make cotton their surplus, they will be able to solve the boll weevil problem.

Through inattention and neglect, the Atlanta school system had reached such a low ebb that it was as well as impossible to have an essential element of restriction. It had reached the point where it could not be rebuilt in a day, or a good many days, to see that this is true, but why it is true.

The lesson Atlanta should draw from present school conditions is the necessity for constant and vigilant preparedness against any crisis or emergency of this sort. Present school conditions should have been foreseen and anticipated by the city and the money necessary to prevent the fearful congestion from which the schools are now just about to be relieved should have been provided long ago.

The situation is further indicative of the necessity for permanent improvements in the system which will enable it to meet the steadily increasing demands upon it. That provision must be made from year

to year, as the city grows, or another few years will find us exactly where we were when we had to go to council and fight for that \$35,000 appropriation.

Atlanta must keep pace with her growth or fall backward, and when she begins to fall that growth will soon stop. If we would continue to grow we must build as we grow. There is no other way to do it.

With the beginning of the new session the Constitution takes occasion to congratulate the board of education upon the progress it has made in readjusting the school system to a basis that will meet the demands made upon it.

With the starvation treatment accorded the schools by the city for the past several years and relieved only by the appropriation made in July, it was not to be expected that the board could have wrought order out of chaos within the limited period between the time that the appropriation became available and the beginning of the term.

However, and while it may be that the system may not be in perfect running order for a month or more as yet, there is room for hope and satisfaction in the certainty that provision has been made for a seat for every school child in Atlanta, that every child and every teacher similarly situated will be given the same hours and the same opportunity, and that the barbarous double session is a thing of the past!

ROLL WEEVIL CONFERENCE.

Georgians, fortunately, have found no occasion for wild or hysterical alarm in the advent of the Mexican cotton boll weevil.

On the contrary, they are facing it calmly. In a business, professional, critical, or course, but to be dealt with according to business methods.

When the pest first came, these states faced terrible agricultural and business disaster. For a time they suffered severely from it, but gradually through the adoption of measures partly to repress the pest, in connection with the early planting of early maturing varieties of cotton, they have reached a point where they can and do make good crops at a profit.

Moreover, they have forebly learned the value and importance of crop diversification and the growing of cattle and home gardens of food, which Editor E. A. Fitzgerald of the Vidalia Herald, in a communication published in The Constitution today, points out as the chief remedy for the boll weevil pest. There is no question that diversification and home-grown foods must play a most important part. With this policy well developed, the south can live comfortably even with cotton crop failure.

Walker County Tax Rate

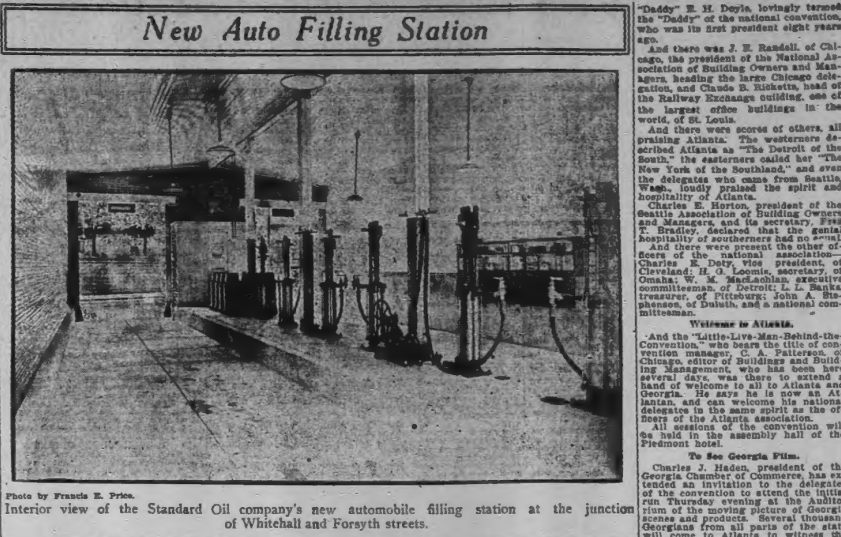

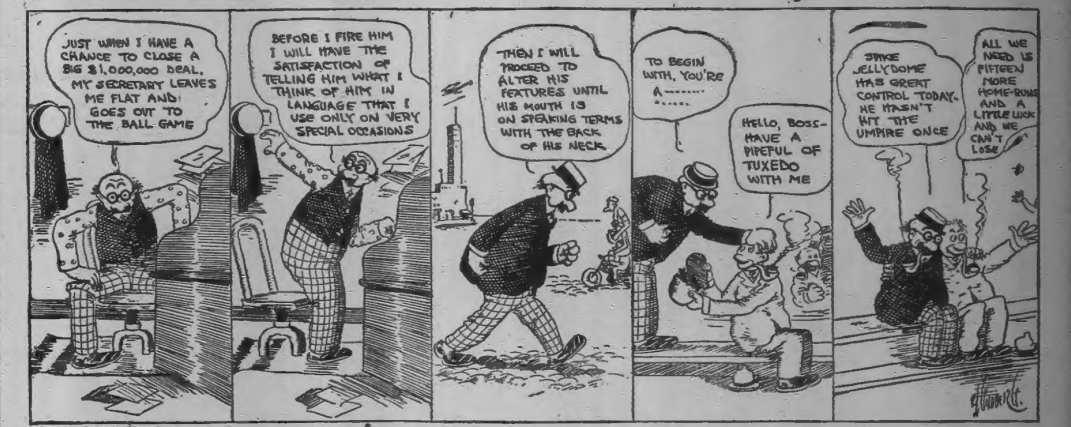
