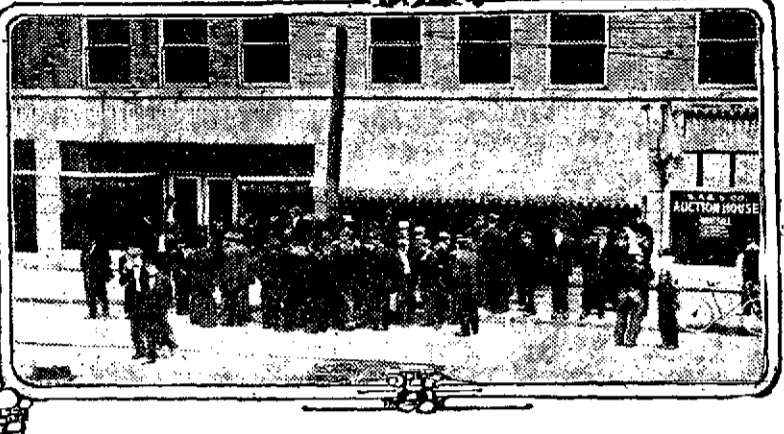

SMITH PLAYING "BABY ACT," SAYS CLAYTON

Construction Chief Reiterates Statement That He Will Not Approve Paving Material.

MYSTERY IS GROWING ABOUT BOY'S IDENTITY

New Orleans, April 28.—Another feature of uncertainty as to the identity of the child in the Dunbar kidnapping case was added today to the maze of conflicting evidence in the receipt of photographs which W. C. Walters, the alleged kidnaper, sent to his father, J. P. Walters, at Boardman, N. C., several months ago.

The photograph of a child which Walters sent his aged father and which he claimed was that of little Bruce Anderson son of a woman living near Boardman, is declared by persons living in that vicinity to be a true likeness of the Anderson child. Numerous persons in New Orleans examined the photograph today and declared it is the same boy that was taken from Walters in Columbia, Miss., last week, and which Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Dunbar identified as their missing son.

W. H. Murray, a rural mail carrier, on whose route J. P. Walters, father of the alleged kidnaper lives near Boardman, writes that he knew the child, Bruce Anderson, well before Walters carried it away about a year ago, and in an affidavit declares he is positive in the identification of the photograph sent by Walters as that of the Anderson boy.

In a letter which Walters wrote Julia Anderson, mother of Bruce, he mentioned that he had had some trouble about a boy whom he had lost, but assured her her boy was safe and happy with him.

The president gave no intimation as to what his previous view had been but democratic senators who talked with him had had the idea that he opposed the exemption and favored the Root amendment to repeal it. When Mr. Wilson discussed the question today he said he felt he should keep his mind absolutely open until some action was necessary, but indicated he would have a very definite opinion ready at the time for settlement.

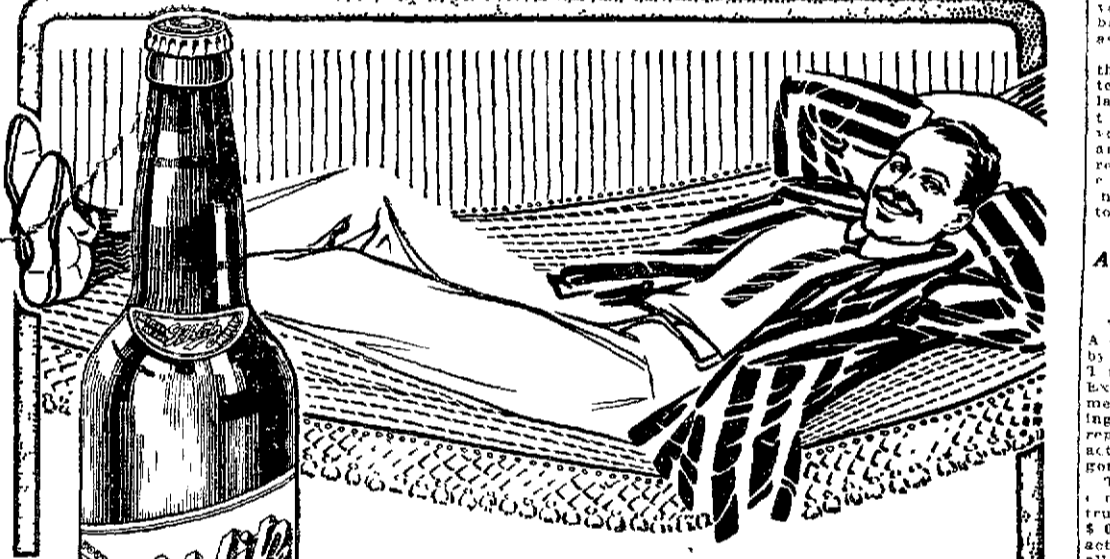
