From Cotton Squares to Open Bolls. The cotton crop, while now (August 8) in a very flourishing condition, is very spotted as to size of plants and age of the same.

On many farms in Georgia and the Atlantic states much of the cotton did not show above ground until the last week in May, and even as late as early in June.
