All of the 4,000 survivors of the Big Battle near Sofia are taken prisoners, according to Vienna Newspaper

SERVIAN MINISTER DENIES BULGARIANS WOULD OCCUPY THE TERRITORY

Says It Is Not Certain Army Reported Crushed Was In Fight-Greeks Drive Bulgars Across River Struma

(By Associated Press.)
VIENNA, July 7.—Thousand upon thousand of the Serbian troops were killed in the battle with Bulgarians, according to the report of the correspondent of the Reichspost. The division consisted of 15,000 men, who were annihilated by a Bulgarian division which outnumbered them. Only 4,000 of the Serbian survivors and those taken prisoners.

According to other newspaper reports, a Bulgarian column of 14,000 men has been sent to reoccupy the Serbian town of Vratsa and is threatening the line of retreat of the Serbian army. The Bulgarians presumably pushed forward from Novi Pazar.

Minister of the Rumanian army said that the Rumanian army would not be compelled either to agree to the Rumanian demands and permit Bulgars to occupy the territory, or to engage in war.
