KANSAS CITY, MEXICO AND ORIENT RY. SOLD

Reorganization Committee Pays More Than Six Million Dollars for Property

WICHITA, Kan., July 6.—The Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railway was sold here today for \$6,000,000 to the reorganization committee representing the bondholders of the company. The bid was made by A. M. Wickwire, of New York City. There were no other bidders.

Application for the receivership of the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railway, which the federal court sold here today to a reorganization committee of New York and London capitalists, was made before Judge John C. Pollock in the federal court in Kansas City, Kan., March 7, 1912.

Eleven receivers were appointed to take over the company's affairs in Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas. Immediately afterward the holders of the company's stocks and bonds began work on plans for the refunding and reorganization of the road, and \$15,000,000 of European capital was raised for the purpose of finishing the road and putting it into operation from Kansas City to the Pacific coast of Mexico.

On April 27 last Judge Pollock, having been informed the reorganization committee had completed its plan for the rehabilitation of the Orient, ordered it sold for an amount not under \$5,000,000.

It was announced that the new company, headed by Edwin Dickinson as president, will assume full management and will begin the work of tending the road from Wichita to Kansas City.

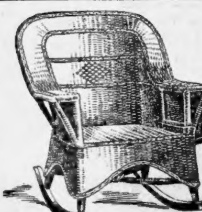

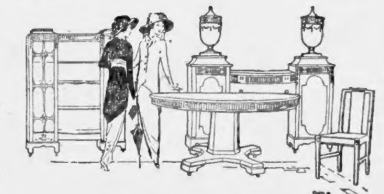

Long Sleeve Suits Don't Keep Men Out Of Piedmont Lake

That the long-sleeved bathing-suit rule doesn't prevent the male portion of Atlanta's population from enjoying their trip to Piedmont lake is proven by the fact that there were more men bathing in the water in the month of June than there were women, boys and girls combined.

In 35,454 separate occasions during the month that has just passed, people took a dip into the lake and 15,798 of these bathers were men. Of boys, there were 7,236 and women and girls made up the remaining 8,118 bathers, which brought the total within a few days of the 35,000 mark. In fact, general manager of Park, estimates that upwards of 3,000 different people enjoyed the lake during this month.

There was a wide difference in the popularity of bathing on different days. In a large measure to weather conditions. On Wednesday, June 10, the record for the month was set by 1,436 bathers while Thursday, June 18, saw only a bare 400 people departing their bathing suits.
