### Parcel Post Marketing.

Ten cities, Atlanta among them, were designated the Postoffice Department last March as experi-nt stations for testing the value of the parcel post a medium of trade between country producers city consumers. Advocates of the plan believed that if direct relations could thus be cultivated, the price of many food commodities would be cheaper and that the farmers' market would be broadened and upbuilt. That these hopes have been realized, in part at least, is indicated by reports from the experiment points, recently made public by the Postmaster

The Atlanta postoffice handled during the summer nths an average of one hundred farm-to-pantry parcels a day, and the new service was marked with ateady growth. At Birmingham there was a daily average of seventy-five such parcels. At St. Louis the record ran to ten thousand during May and June, and the postmaster of that city describes the service as "a popular and useful adjunct to the community's marketing facilities." "It will become an important factor in the commerce of California," says the post-master at San Francisco." "There has been an in-crease of seventy-five per cent in the receipts of farm produce," says the postmaster at Washintson. Inproduce," says the postmaster at washingon. in-deed, in every part of the country where table sup-plies are produced and where the purcel post has been given a trial as a medium of exchange, the results have been encouraging.

It should be noted, however, that certain difficultee must be overcome before the new service is duly
beneficial. The Baltimore postmaster, for example, reports that in his territory many farmers want to sell at the middleman's prices, and the postmaster of Rock Island, fil., well says that until the producer of sharing the middlemen's profits with one another, the system cannot meet with deserved success." The purpose of parcel post marketing is to eliminate rmediate costs as far as possible, but if the profucer insists upon retaining such costs the consumer will naturally prefer to buy in the old way.

Furthermore, many bousekeepers want to see arm produce before buying it. If the rural seller made deceives or dissatisfies them, they are done with him and with parcel post marketing. It is particularly important, therefore, that the farmer should ook carefully to all commodies he ships under this a and should see to it that his customer receives value. But the farmer who establishes a reputation for good produce and fair dealing can build up a large and profitable business with city c

means of the parcel post.

The new service is in no wise perfect; it could not be, as it was inaugurated only about seven months ago. But indications are that it is steadily improving and widening, to such an extent, indeed, that the Postoffice Department has decided to add a number of other cities to those where the experiment is siready under way.

The belief that British cotton mills, and those of other European countries with the exception of Germany and Austria, will soon be operating is strengthened by recent gains in American cotton exports. On Tuesday nearly thirty thousand bales were stripped from New York, a small amount as compared with normal seasons but a distinct increase over the last few weeks. This lot included three thousand, four hundred and five bales to France, the first cotton four numred and nee bases of France, the mean behipped directly to that country since the war began; five thousand, four hundred and seventy-eight bales to Great Britain, seven thousand, four hundred and fifty-eix bales to other European Iands, and more jhan

these shipments, though not impressive, when considered singly or on their own account, are truly significant as forerunners of approaching activity. It is to the interest of Great Britain and of other It is to the interest of Great Striam and of containing that can do so to keep their cotton mills running. All advices are to the effect that within sixty days at the latest British mills must buy cotton in large quantities. It is credibly reported, that ton in large quantities.
