WOMEN ESCAPE DEATH IN EAST POINT AUTO SMASH

Machine Hits Horse in Atlanta Limits—Drags Him Forty Feet Across Border

Three men and two women narrowly escaped death last night at 1 o'clock when an automobile collided with a horse in the East Point road. One of the women, Miss Pauline Brooks, who lives on Capitol avenue, sustained a fracture of the leg between the knee and ankle, and various severe bruises and cuts. She is at Grady hospital.

The other, Mrs. Beale E. Brooks, of 41 East Cain street, was also cut and bruised, but her injuries were not serious and she was able to leave the hospital and go home in a cab after receiving surgical attention.

Frank Tiller, a farmer who lives near Backus, was the host of the automobile party. His injuries, while not serious, and he also left the hospital.

The other men involved in the accident are C. L. Cox, owner of the transfer wagon, who lives at 38 Fortnes avenue, and the chauffeur who was driving the car. The police are in some doubt as to whether there was a chauffeur or whether Tiller was driving.

There was a chauffeur, he disappeared from the scene before the police arrived. Mrs. Brooks told the police there was a chauffeur.

The automobile was going south and they met just on the line between Atlanta and East Point. The horse driven by Cox was killed and dragged some forty feet toward East Point by the automobile. Cox was considerably shaken up. The automobile turned at right angles, climbed part way up a railroad embankment which parallels the East point road, and stopped with its rear wheels across the trolley car tracks, blocking traffic for thirty minutes or more.

Persons arriving on the scene found Tiller trying to soothe the wrath of Cox, while the women lay groaning in the back seat of the automobile.

Grady hospital was called by telephone and the automobile ambulance, with Ambulance Driver Whitman at the wheel, made a very fast run, going six miles and return in twenty-five minutes.

The police at a late hour last night had not been able to establish definitely whether the car belongs to Tiller and was driven by him, or whether it was rented by Tiller and was driven by a chauffeur. Nor were they in a position to make a case for reckless driving until they could find out exactly whether the accident occurred in the corporate limits of Atlanta, or across the line in East Point.

Peterson, in tow of the Curtis, which were caught Thursday in a severe storm on Lake Superior. The Peterson went down near Grand Marais, seems absolutely certain from bodies and wreckage washed ashore.

The three ships cleared from Sault Ste. Marie for North Tonawanda, N. Y., Wednesday morning. None of the several other steamers which went around along the upper lakes during the gale was seriously damaged.

CONVICT GUARD IS ON TRIAL FOR MURDER

Dyer, former convict guard, in the superior court on the charge of murdering Charles Brown, bartender of the Red Light saloon, was begun in the Chatham superior court yesterday. NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—Fifty thousand barrels of wheat and flour from Kansas for relief of Belgian non-combatants will be sent by ship to December 1, according to a telegram from former Governor W. E. Stubbs, directing Kansas relief work. Mr. Stubbs telegraphed he hoped to have a second shipment of 50,000 barrels ready soon.

FRENCH FLYERS HURL BOMBS ON CONSTANCE

Zeppelin Docks Attacked by Two Aeroplanes, One of Which Is Wrecked

AMSTERDAM, via London, Nov. 21.—Two aeroplanes, thought to be French, attacked the Zeppelin dock and shed on Lake Constance today, according to a Friedrichshafen paper. The aeroplanes dropped six bombs, none of which did any damage. One aeroplane was shot down, the other escaped.

The Southern Railway company is installing a modern automatic block signaling system on the twenty-two mile stretch between Howell and Austell, Ga., fifteen miles between Austell and Galloway, and between Galloway and Oglethorpe, Ga. The new system is the most important traffic handle over which heavy business is thrashed including the movement of freight and passengers. The line between Howell and Austell, Tenn., twelve miles, both of which are the northwest and Florida.

The new system will consist of twenty-three signals operated by alternating current, will, in connection with other signals, provide a continuous protection from the Atlanta Terminal station to Austell. Power stations are located at Howell, Austell, Galloway and at the South Inland yards. Eighteen open air transformers are located between Austell and Galloway. The Howell, Austell, Galloway and Oglethorpe will be operated by direct current. When completed this will be a continuous protection from Oglethorpe to Austell.

The signals will be approximately twenty miles apart. In the event of an emergency that the presence of a train, a broken rail, and open or misplaced switch will be indicated by a red light. The signal position with a red light at night and

The second signal in the rear will stand green light at night. This system will enable the engineer to keep himself informed of the position of the train and of the track for approximately 300 feet behind him, thus insuring the safe dispatch of movement and a very large measure of safety.
