## TURKS LOSE 7,000 MILITARY GALLIPOLI SO ONDOR CLAIMS

Czar's Army Has Been Unable So Far to Interfere With the Austro-German Communications, Petrograd Admits

## RUSSIANS CLAIMING VICTORY OVER TURKS

French Claim New Progress Against Germans—Joffre's Men Now Within 100 Yards of Town of Ablain

(By Associated Press.)  
LONDON, May 22.—The French and British operating against the Turks on Gallipoli peninsula had gained further ground, according to an official statement today.  
"On May 19, in the southern area of Gallipoli peninsula," it says, "the French forces, in conjunction with the British, made a considerable advance, and have consolidated the new position."  
"Our aeroplanes dropped bombs against Turkish reinforcements landing at Ak-Bashi Liman, and caused considerable losses."  
"On the night of the 18th-19th the British forces made further progress against the Australian and New Zealand corps, which all were repulsed with heavy loss, their casualties being over 4,000, of which 3,000 were killed. Our losses did not exceed 500."

## Austro-Germans Continue to Hold Strategic Positions

WASHINGTON, May 22.—It is becoming more and more apparent that the battle in central Galicia is of far-reaching importance. The Russians are credited with progress on both Austro-German fronts, but apparently they are unable to menace their communications. ROCKEFELLER READY TO BACK MINE OFFICIALS

Vigorous Cross-Examination Resumed by Chairman Walsh of Commission

(By Associated Press.) WASHINGTON, May 21.—With only one of the eight members of the industrial relations commission present, Chairman Walsh today resumed his vigorous cross-examination of John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Mr. J. Gordon Harman, who protested against the cross-examination of Walsh in his examination of Rockefeller, was one of those absent. Mr. Rockefeller reiterated his opinion that when the authorities failed to protect life and property, the private citizen had the right to use force to protect himself. Walsh read a letter to Rockefeller by L. M. Bowers in September, 1913, saying: "Old Mother Jones has been on the ground for two weeks, but we understand the governor has ordered her to be taken to the state line and to be told not to return." Walsh then read part of Rockefeller's letter to Bowers saying he would back the mine strikers in everything they did and asked if it wasn't written after deportations had occurred. "Will you be kind enough to read all of that?" Rockefeller asked. "I can't do that at this time," said Walsh, "but any letter you desire to read you may submit after I have concluded my examination."
