NEW YORK, May 3.—With the precision of soldiers, 30,000 woman suffragists and men assembled marched through the heart of New York City this afternoon in the most wonderful and brilliant "votes for women" demonstration ever held in North America.

Between 7:00 and 10:00 persons were massed along Fifth Avenue, and a thunder of cheers greeted the marchers all along the line. The women wore disorder. Twelve hundred foot and mounted police lined the route and those who attempted to interfere with the procession met instant forceful resistance.

Shortly after 2:30 a black Mr. Richard Burleson, general marshal, gave a lusty "forward march" and amidst ringing cheers the great army swept forward. The women were very firm, and toward the end there was much shouting among the marchers who were joined to the head and the exterior.

TECH WALLEPS ANALYSIS OF GOOD STAINS MAY SOLVE PHAGAN MYSTERY

Three Former Employees at Pencil Factory Are Summoned to Testify. Expected That Frank and Watchman Will Be Questioned Further.

It is reported that three young women, former employees of the National Pencil Factory, will be important witnesses for the Coroner's jury in the Phagan case on Monday.

Dr. Claude Smith, city bacteriologist, was asked by the police today to make a chemical analysis of the bloodstains on the shirt found in the back yard of the home of Lee.

The report was given to Dr. Smith by Detective Hooper. The tests and comparisons it will be determined whether the garment was a "plant" or not.

Soleitor Morse and Chief of Detectives were summoned for two hours today in a discussion of the case. At the conclusion neither would make a public announcement.

The inquest will be resumed at 2 o'clock. Leo M. Frank has not yet given any testimony before the Coroner's jury, and it is planned for him to be heard on Monday. It is also likely that Lee, the night watchman, will be examined still further.

When the Coroner's jury verdict is rendered the case automatically goes to the Grand Jury. Solicitor Morse and the Grand Jury will not take up the case officially until the Coroner's jury has concluded its investigation.

It is not likely that the body of the unfortunate girl will be examined. County Physician Hart says that no further examination is necessary, as the evidence on this point is very clear and exact.

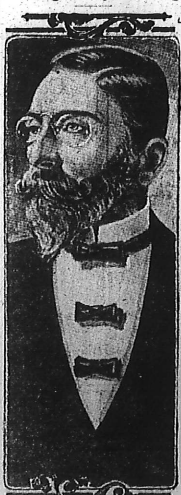
