### COLONEL GETS SIX CENTS FOR DAMAGE CAUSED BY LABEL

Editor Newett Says He Was Mistaken and Makes Apology—Roosevelt Asked Only Nominal Damage Verdict

### NO COSTS ASSESSED BY VERDICT OF JURY

Colonel Says He Did Not Bring Suit for Monetary Damage, but Only That Character Might Be Vindicated

MAY 31.—Colonel Roosevelt today made his last statement in the case against George A. Newett, who charged the colonel with libelous and defamatory statements and having caused damage to the plaintiff's reputation. The jury awarded the nominal damage of six cents for the injury to the plaintiff's reputation. Each party will have to pay his own expenses.

Justice Flannagan instructed the jury to award a verdict for the plaintiff. The colonel left for Chicago and the case will be closed in a few days.

The afternoon session began the trial with the plaintiff's case. The defendant's case was heard in the afternoon.

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### Conley's Statement Analyzed From Two Different Angles

The Weak Points in the Negro's Story Are Shown in One Analysis and the Points That Would Seem to Add to Its Reasonableness Are Weighed in the Other.

BELOW are given analyses of the negro, James Conley's latest statement or confession from two viewpoints.
