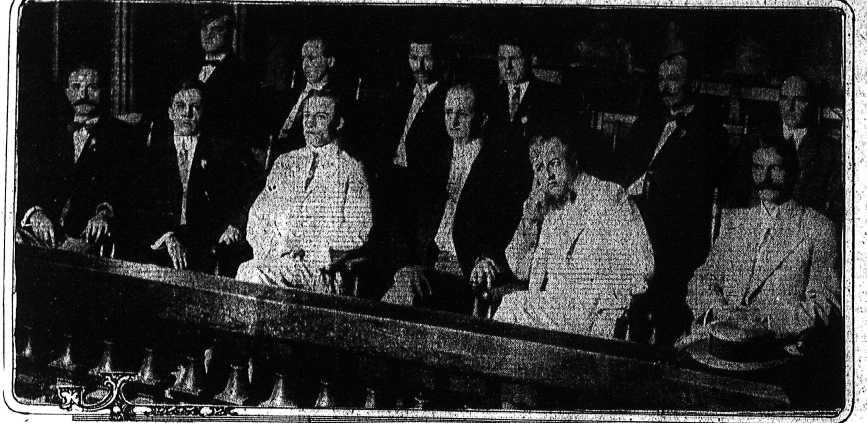

The trial of Leo M. Frank for the murder of Mary Phagan in an Atlanta hotel, which began in the courtroom of the Fulton superior court, Tuesday morning, the last word for the defendant was a simple "innocent."
